Welcome Assembly by Teachers

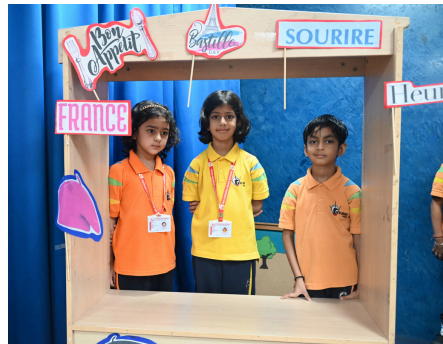

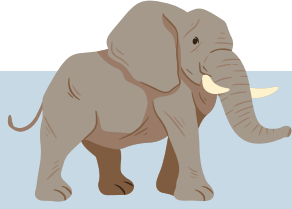


Hindi Diwas Celebrations

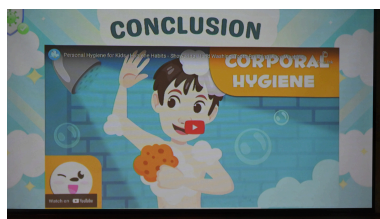


Socio-Emotional Learning Programme Emotional Charades & Awareness drive on Diabetes in children

Celebration of World Chess Day- Inter House Competition

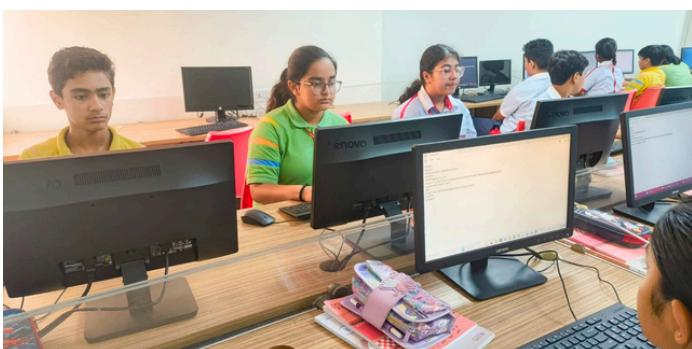

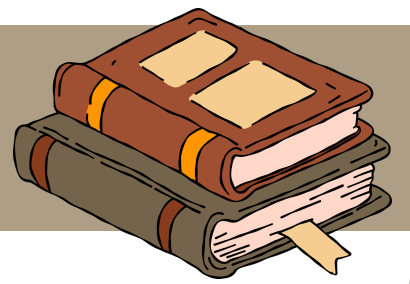

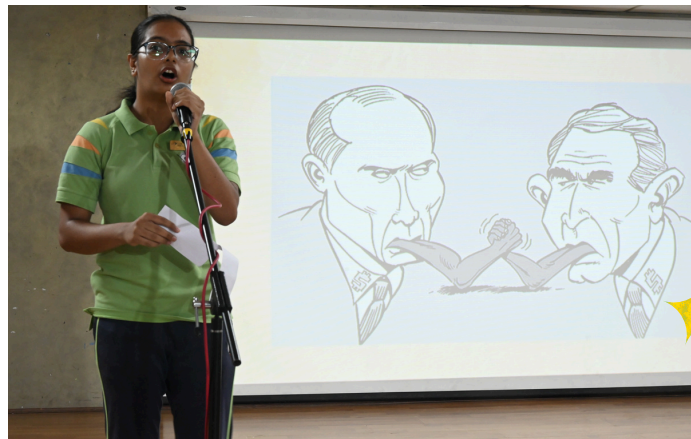

Celebrating Togetherness: Fresher's Party 2025-26

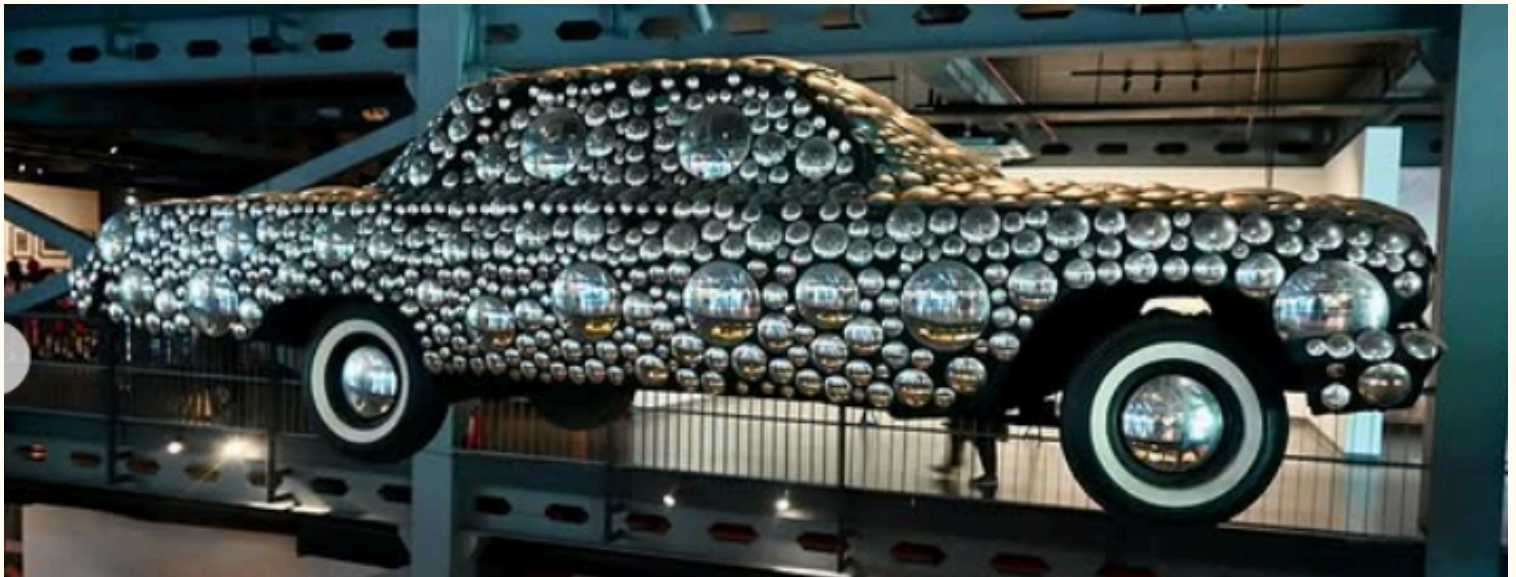

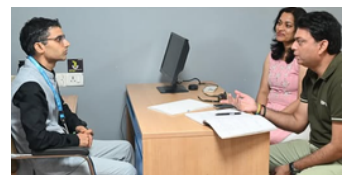
Orientation Day for New Parents

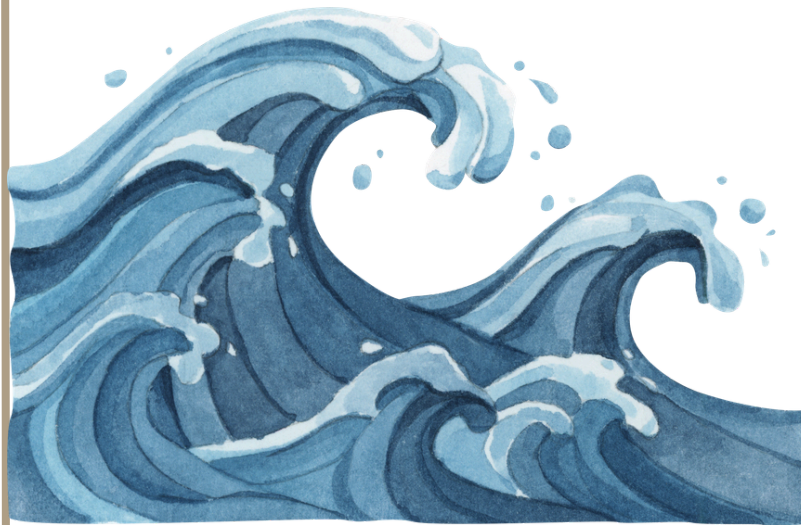
Nature's Dance

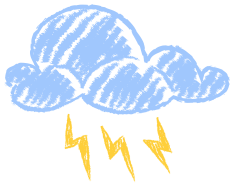
O Water!

Five days later, most villagers abandoned the town. Many called it cursed. Zoya's sister was devastated, but Zoya, though broken, refused to give up.

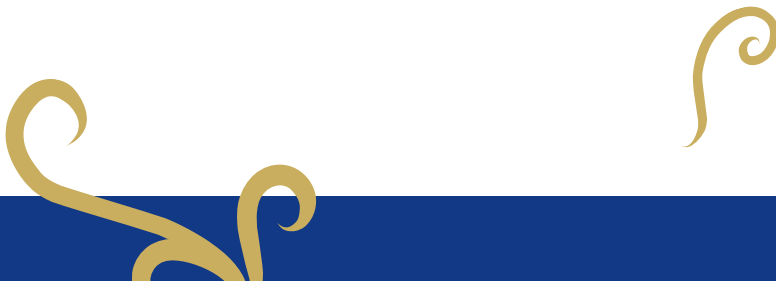
She poured her heart into rebuilding. She signed petitions, made awareness videos, cooked food for the poor, visited the injured in hospitals, and motivated others to act. She told herself, "This village can be a home again."

Her pain was immense, but her resilience was stronger. Inspired by Zoya, the villagers came together. They worked tirelessly, building new houses and schools. It wasn't easy. It took nearly a year, but in the end, the town stood tall again.

Everyone credited Zoya for her spirit. When asked what kept her so motivated, she smiled and said:

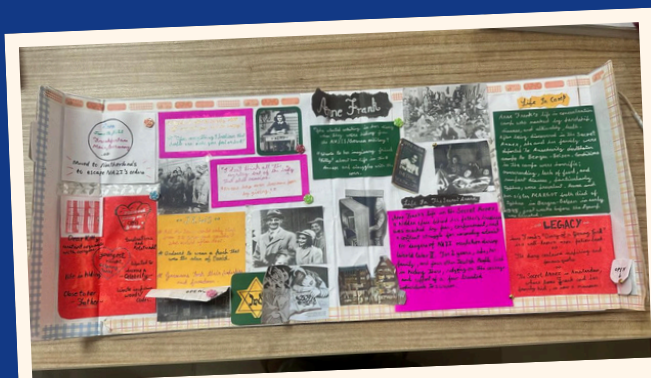

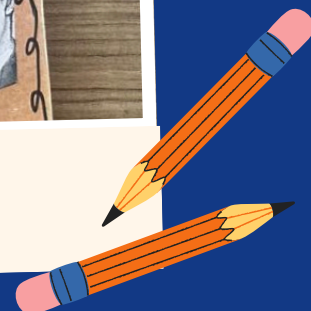
Life of Anne Frank through a Grade VIII student's perspective
