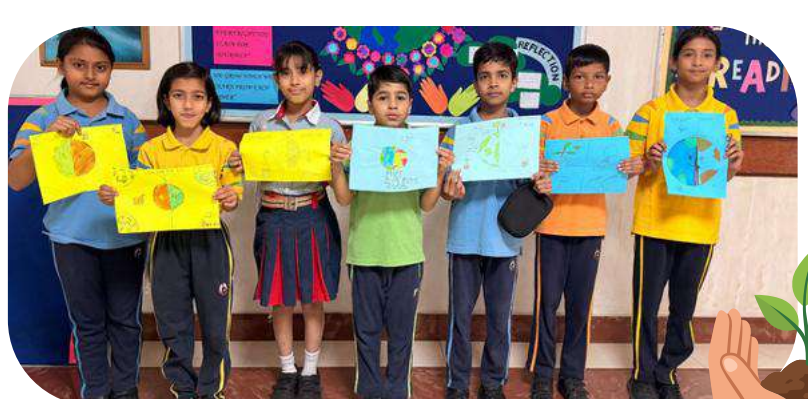




EARTH DAY CELEBRATION

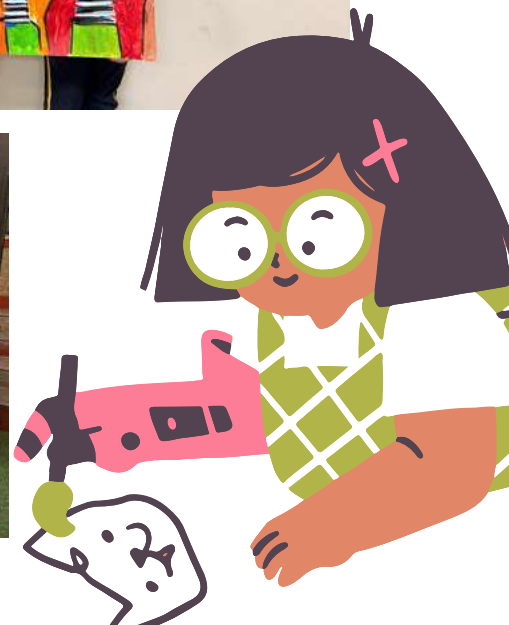




GOENKA COLOURS OF IMAGINATION

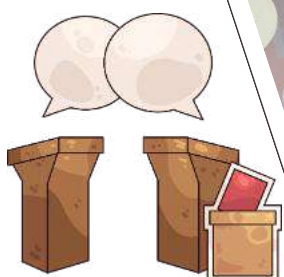


HINDI DEBATE COMPETITION

GD Goenka High School, in partnership with Go Sharpener, continues to promote the Sustainable Development Goals through engaging sustainability-focused activities across all grades.

In May 2026, students from Grades 3 to 12 participated in a variety of eco-friendly initiatives that encouraged creativity, environmental awareness, and responsible living. Grade 3 students created bird baths by reusing plastic boxes and decorating them with pebbles, learning the importance of recycling and caring for birds and nature. Grade 4 students made colorful bookmarks from recycled paper, understanding the value of reducing waste and reusing resources. Grade 5 students prepared eco-friendly dhoop using natural materials, reinforcing the significance of environmental conservation.

Students from Grades 6 to 12 celebrated International Biodiversity Day through activities such as Nature's Carbon Day, My Biodiversity Register, Habitat Heroes, and A Nature Bookmark. They also observed International Plastic-Free Day by using plastic-free bottles and creating a Green Event Guardians Toolkit that included handmade seed paper.

This was truly an enriching experience that brought science beyond the classroom and into real life.



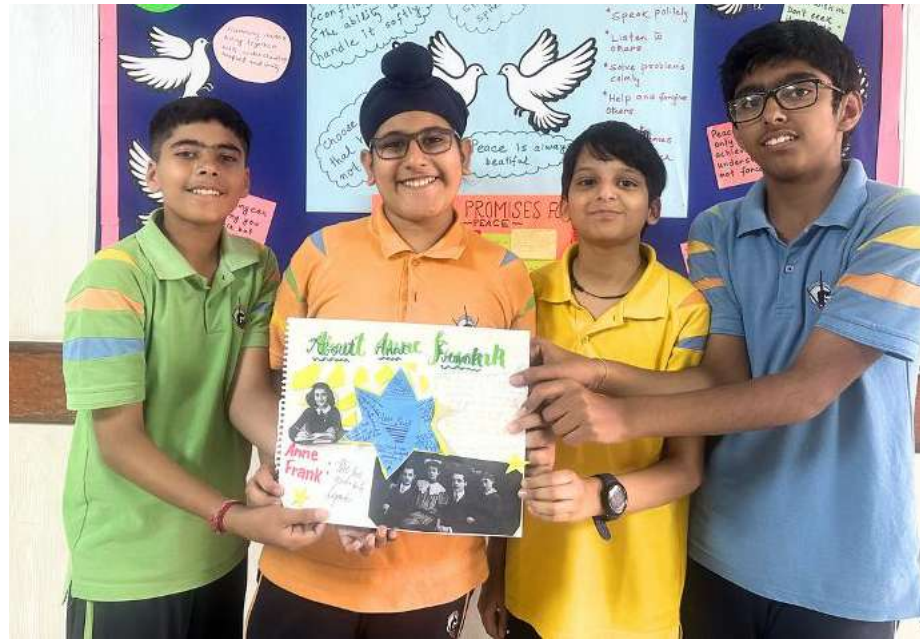
Learning Beyond Textbooks Through Inter-disciplinary Projects

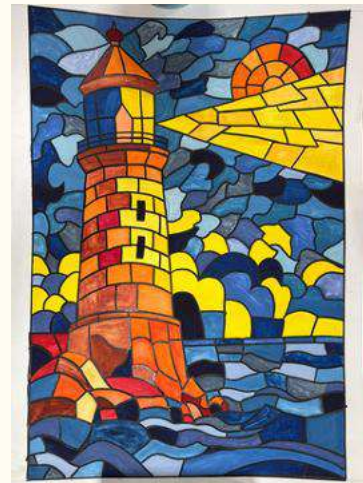
